

A-Z of Waste and Recycling Services Provided by Goulburn Mulwaree Council and some other local service providers

Council Clean Up – Council no longer provides the annual kerbside bulky pick-up. This has been replaced with two free self-haul weekends:

- On the first weekend in May each year, Goulburn Mulwaree residents can dispose of up to 2 mattresses/sprung bases (any size), 2 fridges/freezers, 1 air-conditioner, up to 1m3 of e-waste (computers, televisions, printers, fax machines and computer accessories only), and/or up to 2m3 of clean steel items (including electrical appliances with an electrical lead) per property, free of charge at Council's waste centres. Goulburn Mulwaree residents only. All loads must be transported to one of Council's waste centres. Only domestic items will be accepted - no commercial waste. All waste/items outside of those listed above will be charged the appropriate fee for disposal.
- On the first weekend in November each year, Goulburn Mulwaree residents can dispose of up to 2m3 of bulky household general waste (such as household furniture, green waste, cardboard and steel) per property, free of charge at Council's waste centres. Goulburn Mulwaree residents only. All loads must be transported to one of Council's waste centres. Only domestic items will be accepted - no commercial waste. All loads must be fully sorted so that recyclables can be placed in the appropriate areas at the waste centre, or charges will apply.

Household Chemical CleanOut – this event is held annually (date TBC, usually held between July and December). The CleanOut is held in Goulburn annually and alternates between Tarago and Marulan each year. Only domestic hazardous waste is accepted. The following items are accepted or call the EPA Environment Line in 131 555 for more information: Solvents and household cleaners, floor care products, ammonia-based cleaners, pesticides and herbicides, poisons, pool chemicals, hobby chemicals, acids and alkalis, fluorescent globes and tubes, smoke detectors, paint and paint-related products, gas bottles, fire extinguishers, car and household batteries, motor oils and cooking oils.

Animals - deceased	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn and Marulan. Must be declared at the gate for immediate burial.
Appliances	Some household appliances and electrical goods may be accepted by local second-hand stores.
Asbestos	Correctly packaged, stored and transported asbestos is accepted at Goulburn Waste Management Centre. If you plan on taking asbestos to Goulburn Waste Management Centre for disposal,

Barbecues	<p>Can be disposed of in the steel pile at Council's Waste Management Centres. Gas bottles must be placed in the separate, designated area. Second-hand stores may accept working barbecues.</p>
Batteries - all types of household batteries (domestic quantities)	<p>Household batteries can be recycled at Aldi supermarket in Goulburn through the Aldi Battery Recycling Program. Free Household Chemical CleanOut. Details: Search Household Chemical CleanOut at www.epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.</p>

Clean fill	Quantities less than two cubic metres can be taken to Goulburn Waste Management Centre. Call the Waste Info Line on 4823 4417 for advice on larger quantities.
Cleaning products - chemicals	Free Household Chemical CleanOut. Details: Search Household Chemical CleanOut at www.epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.
Clothing	Goulburn has a number of second-hand stores, many of which accept donated, reusable items and sell to the public.
Computers	E-waste recycling is provided through Goulburn Waste Management Centre. Standard load fees apply.
Concrete/masonry - can be mixed with bricks, roof tiles, terracotta pipes	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn and Marulan.
Electrical items	Some household appliances and electrical goods may be accepted by local second-hand stores. Non-working whitegoods (fridges, dishwashers, microwaves, ovens) can also be taken to Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. Fees apply.
E-waste such as computers, printers and televisions plus many accessories	E-waste recycling is provided through Goulburn Waste Management Centre.
Fill - hard fill, demolition including concrete, bricks and tiles	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn and Marulan.
Fire extinguishers (domestic quantities)	Free Household Chemical CleanOut. Details: Search Household Chemical CleanOut at www.epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.
Fluorescent globes and tubes (domestic quantities)	Free Household Chemical CleanOut. Details: Search Household Chemical CleanOut at www.epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.
Foam	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. Can be mixed with other garbage for landfill.
Food scraps	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. For residents in the domestic collection zone in Goulburn City and Marulan, food scraps can be mixed with organic waste for collection. Residents must purchase their own 240L bin for this service.
Fridges and whitegoods	As fridges, freezers and air conditioners must be degassed a fee applies at Council's Waste Management Centres. Some working whitegoods, household appliances and electrical goods may be accepted by local second-hand stores.
Fuel - motor (domestic quantities)	Free Household Chemical CleanOut. Details: Search Household Chemical CleanOut at www.epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.
Furniture	Goulburn has a number of second-hand stores, many of which accept donated items and sell to the public.

Garbage - mixed for landfill	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. Hazardous wastes must not be included. Recyclable items should be sorted and put in the designated locations at the Waste Management Centres. For residents in the domestic collection zone in Goulburn City and Marulan, garbage that cannot be recycled or composted goes in the Council provided red lid bin.
Garden waste - can be mixed with food scraps	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. For residents in the domestic collection zone in Goulburn City and Marulan, Council provides a collection service for mixed garden organics and food waste 16 times a year. Residents must purchase their own 240L bin for this service.
Gas bottles	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. Free Household Chemical CleanOut. Details: Search Household Chemical CleanOut at www.epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.
Glass	Glass can be dropped off for free at Endeavour Industries Resource Recovery Centre at 54 Sinclair Street, Goulburn. Small (household) quantities can be put in the co-mingled (mixed) recycling areas at Council's Waste Management Centres in Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago.
Herbicides (domestic quantities)	Free Household Chemical CleanOut. Details: Search Household Chemical CleanOut at www.epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.

Iron - recyclable	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago.
Mattresses	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. Mattresses will be charged at the full rate regardless of whether they are stripped or not.
Medical waste	A specialist medical waste bin is located outside Goulburn Base Hospital on Goldsmith Street, Goulburn. Medical waste from the home must be disposed of through local health services or private waste contractors. Medical waste must not be taken to Council's Waste Management Centres or put in domestic waste bins.
Medicines	Return your unused or out of date medicines to your local pharmacy. More information is available from www.returnmed.com.au or by calling 1300 650 835.
Metals - scrap and car bodies	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. May also be accepted at local scrap metal recyclers. Details available from the Yellow Pages .

Organics - garden waste and food scraps	<p>Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. For residents in the domestic collection zone in Goulburn City and Marulan, Council provides a collection service for mixed garden organics. Residents must purchase their own 240L bin for this service.</p>

Paper	<p>Free at Endeavour Industries Resource Recovery Centre, 54 Sinclair Street, Goulburn. Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. Fees apply. For residents in the domestic collection zone in Goulburn City and Marulan, household paper can be put in the yellow lid recycling bin provided by Council for collection.</p>
Pesticides and herbicides (domestic quantities)	Free Household Chemical CleanOut. Details: Search Household Chemical CleanOut at www.epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.

Pine - treated	<p>Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago for disposal in landfill. May be accepted at some second hand building suppliers.</p>
Pine - untreated	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago for chipping.
Pipes - plastic	<p>Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan or Tarago. May be recycled at second hand building suppliers.</p>
Pipes - terracotta - can be mixed with concrete, bricks and roof tiles	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn and Marulan.
Plastics	<p>Endeavour Industries Resource Recovery Centre at 54 Sinclair Street, Goulburn accepts recyclable plastics with the triangle recycling symbol and any number from 1 to 5 inside. If you have quantities of other plastic items and are not sure if they can be recycled, call the centre on 4821 4830. Household plastics can also be included in co-mingled recycling taken to Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn,</p>

	<p>Marulan and Tarago.</p> <p>If the plastic can't be recycled, it can be taken to Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago for disposal in landfill. See 'Chemical Containers' (agricultural and veterinary) for advice on disposing of DrumMUSTER eligible plastic containers.</p> <p>For residents in the domestic collection zone in Goulburn City and Marulan, plastic containers with the triangle recycling symbol and any number from 1 to 5 inside can be put in the yellow lid recycling bin provided by Council for collection.</p>
Plastic shopping bags	<p>It's best to avoid plastic shopping bags but if you have some to dispose of, many supermarkets have a collection point at their stores. In Goulburn, plastic bags can be taken to Coles and Woolworths supermarkets.</p>
Poisons (domestic quantities)	<p>Free Household Chemical CleanOut planned. Details: Search Household Chemical CleanOut at www.epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.</p>
Polystyrene	<p>Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago, where it will be sent to landfill.</p> <p>Small items of polystyrene (e.g. meat trays and cups) also cannot be recycled in Goulburn Mulwaree. These items need to go in the red lid garbage bin for domestic collections or included in mixed waste (garbage for landfill) if taken to Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan or Tarago.</p>
Pool chemicals (domestic quantities)	<p>Free Household Chemical CleanOut. Details: Search Household Chemical CleanOut at www.epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.</p>
Printers - computer	<p>E-waste recycling is provided through Goulburn Waste Management Centre. Standard load fees apply.</p>
Recycling - co-mingled/mixed household recycling including plastic bottles and containers, glass bottles and jars, steel tins, aluminium cans and small quantities of paper	<p>Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. Items can be mixed together. It is preferred that large quantities of paper and bulky cardboard is kept separate put in the designated collection bin.</p> <p>For residents in the domestic collection zone in Goulburn City and Marulan, recycling can be put in the yellow lid recycling bin provided by Council for collection.</p>
Recycling - separated household recycling	<p>Endeavour Industries Resource Recovery Centre, 54 Sinclair Street, Goulburn. Items must be separated and put in the designated locations. Free drop off. Items accepted include most plastic bottles and containers, glass bottles and jars, steel tins, aluminium cans and paper/cardboard.</p>
Scrap metal	<p>Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago.</p>

Syringes and medical waste	<p>A specialist medical waste bin is located outside Goulburn Base Hospital on Goldsmith St, Goulburn.</p> <p>Medical waste from the home (human and veterinary) must be disposed of through local health services or private waste contractors. Medical waste must not be taken to Council's Waste Management Centres or put in domestic waste bins.</p> <p>Small, yellow collection containers for syringes are also located in some public toilets.</p> <p>Littering syringes is specifically defined as aggravated or dangerous litter. If you see a syringe in a public place, please call the Needle Clean Up Hotline immediately on 1800 633 353.</p>
Telephones - not mobile	Taken to Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan or Tarago for disposal in landfill.
Televisions	E-waste recycling is provided through Goulburn Waste Management Centre. Standard load fees apply.
Tiles/masonry - can be mixed with concrete, bricks, terracotta pipes	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn and Marulan.
Timber - untreated	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago.
Timber - treated	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago for disposal in landfill. Re-use may be possible if safety precautions are followed so check with a second hand building outlet for advice.
Transmission fluids (domestic quantities)	Free Household Chemical CleanOut. Details: Search Household Chemical CleanOut at www.epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.
Tyres - car, motorcycle, truck and tractor	Council's Waste Management Centres at Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago.
